

2022 Symposium Speakers

- **John Beakes** is a graduate of the United States Naval Academy who served as an officer in nuclear submarines before embarking on a business career. His lifelong interest in military history led him to study officers of the Continental Army, resulting in authoring and co-authoring several books.
- **Doug Bostick**, Executive Director and CEO of the SC Battleground Preservation Trust since 2011, is also the author of 26 books covering a variety of Southern topics. He is a graduate of the College of Charleston and earned a Master's degree from the University of South Carolina.
- **William Davies** serves as the Vice Chair of the SC American Revolution Sestercentennial Commission, Vice President of the SC Historical Society and serves on numerous other boards and foundations. He was an attorney with Nelson Mullins Riley and Scarborough law Firm from 1972-2009.
- **Dr. Tray Dunaway**, a retired board-certified general surgeon and professional speaker, is also a member of the Historic Camden Foundation, performs an interpretation of an 18th century physician, an interpreter of the Declaration of Independence and Bill of Rights, and is a Sergeant and trainer for the Revolutionary War Field Days Cannon Crew as well as a Camden Battlefield certified tour guide.
- **Randell Jones** is the author of several award-winning history books. He served as a consultant for 14 years to the then-Superintendent of the Overmountain Victory National Historic Trail. In 2013, the Daughters of the American Revolution presented him its national History Award Medal for his body of work in the prior 10 years.
- **Rick Wise** has a B.A. History and a Master of Education Degree from the University of South Carolina, and a Master of Arts in Military History. He served 23 years in the U.S. Army and is a combat veteran. He ran the Troops to Teachers Program in South Carolina and helped over 500 veterans and spouses become teachers. Rick now works with the South Carolina Battleground Preservation Trust and the Liberty Trail Project.
- **Rev. Dr. Paul Wood, Jr.** is a United Methodist minister. Dr. Wood made the American Revolution in the South his hobby five years ago. His article on Dickey Langston was the first to be published by the SC 250th Sestercentennial Commission. Rev. Wood is currently doing research on William "Bloody Bill" Cunningham.

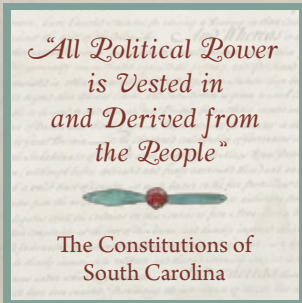
